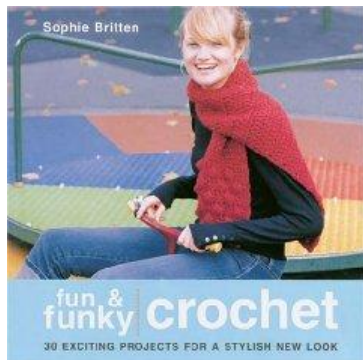

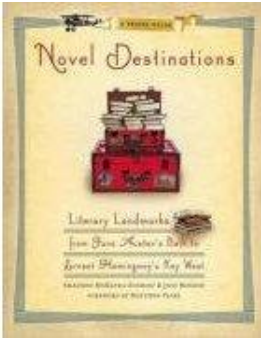
*100 Crafts Under \$10* by *Better Homes and Gardens*

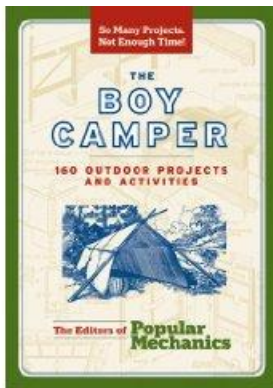
*Fun & Funky Crochet: 30 Exciting Projects for a Stylish New Look* by Sophie Britten
